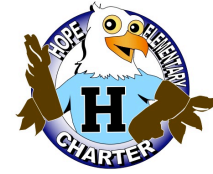


Hope Charter Leadership Academy

Explain expectations, instructional goals and grading systems to students and parents Communicate frequently with families verbally and electronically (website). Consider the strengths and needs of individual students when planning instruction, and differentiate instruction to meet the students needs. Provide workshops, and parent advocacy meetings to allow parents to learn how to help their students Offer resources that will help students be successful academically, socially and emotionally. Create a safe, welcoming environment for students and parents.
